DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I first heard of this play when friends from a neighbouring drama group were enthusing about how great it had been to perform. I didn't see the production but it stuck in my mind, particularly after directing Arcadia, another work spanning two time periods. When I finally got round to reading it I was immediately completely drawn into its exploration of several themes, done through diverse and rounded characters and a considerable amount of wit, all bound together by a dramatic, disturbing sub plot. I have to say that carried away by the dialogue as I was, it was only when I came to start directing it that I appreciated the practical complexities of its production! My particular thanks to Andy Cox for his imagination and skills in meeting these.



So the work was inspired by the characters depicted in the oil-on-canvas An Experiment on a Bird in the Air Pump, painted by Joseph Wright of Derby in 1768, the experiment being that described in Robert Boyle's hypothesis of 1660.

It reflects the emerging importance of the age of Enlightenment and the Industrial Revolution and inspired Shelagh Stephenson's themes. There is the natural philosopher, now dubbed a "scientist", exploring a thesis regardless of his experiment's effect on life, in this case a bird. There is the disinterest of some, the dispassionate fascination shown by the young man and then the highly emotional reaction of the young girl. All depict the accepted gender roles of the period. Through scenes set in the same house in Newcastle upon Tyne approaching New Year's Eve at the end of 1799 and 1999 we explore how these roles have developed and also examine how scientific ethics have changed. Or have they? Was the custom of grave robbing in order to provide bodies for the examination of physical deformities so much worse than the elimination of embryos identified as having those same deformities? How much has capitalism impinged on the direction of scientific enquiry? Are relationships where both partners are accepted as having equal career opportunities necessarily easier and more fulfilling than those of a previous era when only men could, or do they simply engender different sources of disharmony? I hope that tonight's performance leaves you debating all these issues, plus a few more!

I have been blessed with an exceptionally talented cast for this production and would particularly like to welcome our two new members, Emma and Matt. I have also had the invaluable support of assistant director, Richard, and an experienced, scarily competent backstage, props, set, costume, publicity and tech crew which has all contributed to making this a hugely enjoyable production to direct, so my heartfelt thanks to every one of them.

Thank you for being here this evening and enjoy the show...




storytelling. If you prefer working behind the scenes, we have opportunities in stage management, set design, costume creation, lighting, sound, and more.




